# HERE FOR ALL

In recent years, the Community Foundation has prioritized improving its ability to serve all of Linn County. For too long, rural communities and people of color have faced significant barriers to accessing resources. Through learning cohorts, donor engagement, and a new type of charitable fund, in 2023 we helped connect these groups to the philanthropic and professional resources available to build a strong and vibrant community.

### PHILANTHROPY FOR ALL

In 2023, donors in Mount Vernon worked with the Community Foundation to establish two Community Betterment Funds. Operating much like a standalone foundation, these funds allow Mount Vernon to raise and distribute charitable gifts in the ways that best suit the community. Through Community Betterment Funds, more Linn County communities can access and leverage philanthropic resources.




## LEARNING FOR ALL

Throughout 2023, the second Thrive Cohort met for relationship building, networking and intentional learning. This group of 19 Black, Brown and Biracial nonprofit professionals heard from local leaders and experts on a wide range of topics to build skills to strengthen their organizations. Since 2021, the Thrive Cohort has worked to help nonprofits close the racial leadership gap and diversify staff and managerial teams. The Thrive Cohort is supported in part by the Alliant Energy Foundation.









### COMMUNITY FOR ALL

We envision a vibrant and inclusive Linn County where all people thrive. In pursuit of this, we worked with hundreds of donor partners to distribute more than \$11 million in grants to 634 nonprofits in 2023. Through partnerships with local nonprofits and philanthropists, we're helping to create a stronger future for Linn County.

## **RESOURCES FOR ALL**

In 2023, the Community Foundation launched a new website with valuable resources. A new giving hub, called the Nonprofit Giving Center, helps connect the needs of nonprofits to donors who want to make a difference. ### CONNECTION FOR ALL

After the 2020 derecho, local governments and Linn Area Partners Active in Disaster (LAP-AID) observed that some groups, including people who face language barriers or have disabilities, were not always aware of resources available. The LAP-AID Inclusion Cohort brought together ten community leaders from traditionally excluded groups for collective learning and connection to community resources. It was partially funded by the Philanthropic Preparedness, Resiliency, and Emergency Partnership (PPREP), a project of The Funders Network.










### Assets by Fund Type
